- Not included in the curriculum
- Taught insufficiently
- Not linked to later working reality

- for in class teaching
- for vets and veterinary paraprofessionals
- with a focus on the link between welfare and health





MODULE 08 // PAIN MANAGEMENT

Pain is an issue of high relevance for animal welfare. It impacts the welfare of an animal directly and indirectly by causing discomfort, suffering, delayed healing and weakened immune system.





Animal welfare related issues like stress. malnutrition and lack of hygiene can increase the risk of infectious diseases.





MODULE 11 // **VACCINATIONS**

Vaccinations can be an efficient way of preventing infectious diseases and therefore improve the welfare of animals while reducing the need for other treatments.



MODULE 12 // **EUTHANASIA**

The euthanasia of an animal that is suffering with no prospect of relief or recovery is an important part of applied animal welfare.

The clinical examination is an important tool for animal health professionals to identify diseases, medical conditions and care deficiencies, which can compromise the






