 Educators must continually adapt their materials to reflect new insights and developments.


• Age-Appropriate Education:

The Need for Transformation



Holistic Impact: Animal well-being,

Addressing not only specific issues but also the underlying factors that contribute to animal suffering

Interconnected Challenges: (Agriculture, livelihoods, environmental conservation, and public health)Recognize these connections and finds sustainable solutions that benefit both animals and people

Environmental Conservation:

Addressing issues like overgrazing and deforestation through a transformative approach can help protect Rwanda's ecosystems

• Public Health:

Diseases that affect animals can also affect humans (zoonoses, AMR), so improving animal well-being is critical for preventing disease outbreaks and safeguarding public health.

Education and Awareness:

This increased awareness can lead to more informed decision-making and a stronger commitment to animal well-being.

Conservation Principles

C.C represents a shift in the way conservationists think about and approach their work

• It strives to find a middle ground between the sometimes-conflicting goals of conserving biodiversity and respecting the welfare of individual animals.

Shift from merely teaching facts about animals to fostering empathy and understanding of their experiences, needs, and emotions. (**Prioritizing Animal Welfare)**

encourages students to think deeply about their own values and beliefs concerning animals. (Ethical Considerations)


highlight the interconnectedness of species and ecosystems and teach students to consider the well-being of animals within the broader context of conservation efforts.(Biodiversity and Ecosystem Ethics)

Teaching about conflict resolution is a key aspect of compassionate conservation(Human-Wildlife Conflict Resolution)

Engaging local communities in discussions about animal welfare and conservation practices, respecting their cultural beliefs, and seeking collaborative solutions that benefit both animals and people (**Community Engagement**)

Animal welfare education guided by compassionate conservation should inspire students to become advocates for animals (**Promoting Empathy and Action**)













Rethinking Curriculum and Pedagogy



Incorporating modern animal welfare and compassionate conservation topics into the curriculum equips students with

- The knowledge and values needed to address current and future challenges related to animals, the environment, and ethical considerations.
- It empowers individuals to make informed, responsible, and compassionate choices, contributing to a more ethical and sustainable coexistence with animals and the natural world.


